Resolutions not received by March 1st will be considered late resolutions and must go through the following procedures to be considered at the AGM.

(1) Late resolutions may only be introduced if received by the Resolutions Committee Chair at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the commencement of an Annual Meeting, providing that enough copies are supplied in order that they may be circulated to all Member Representatives at the Meeting Registration Desk at the time of registration and provided that a resolution to allow its debate receives an affirmative vote of three-fifths (60%) of the Member Representatives in attendance at the meeting;

(2) Late resolutions will be reviewed by the Resolutions Committee prior to the Meeting and only those of a subject matter which could not have been submitted by the normal deadline date outlined in section 10.4 will be considered.

Re: National Health & Fitness Day

Most civic leaders understand the negative health impacts when people become inactive. Many have expressed concern that their recreational facilities are being underutilized and welcome ways to stimulate their citizens to live a more active, healthy lifestyle. I hope you will study the enclosed draft resolution and bring it to your council for passage.

National Health & Fitness Day is the subject of a motion introduced by me in the Senate and of a Private Member's Bill, Bill C-443, *An Act to Establish a National Health and Fitness Day*, introduced by a colleague of mine in the House of Commons, Mr. John Weston, MP on September 24, 2012.

Councils that have endorsed the concept have taken a variety of approaches; some plan to open all their facilities on a complementary basis for the day; others will reduce the cost, but still join in the national movement. My hope is that you will endorse the motion to encourage participation in recreation and to use the opportunity to provide your citizens with information for living healthier lifestyles.

You may also want to encourage other local governments across Canada and the Federation of Canadian Municipalities to endorse National Health & Fitness Day. So far, the FCM has given the motion favorable attention. Should your Council choose to join the momentum of creating National Health & Fitness Day, please forward a copy of your resolution to the FCM.

SUMMARY

practice fitness activities;

Whereas the Government of Canada wishes
to encourage local governments to increase
Canadians' participation in healthy physical
activities;

Whereas the Government of Canada wishes
to encourage local governments in Canada to
recognize the first Saturday in June, in each
and every year, as National Health and Fitness Day
and to make their health, recreational, sports and
fitness facilities available to Canadians at a
reduced rate or free of charge;

ment Week in Canada, and walking and cycling
are great ways to reduce vehicle pollution and

Approved Community Hall waiver – year to date: \$1217.68.

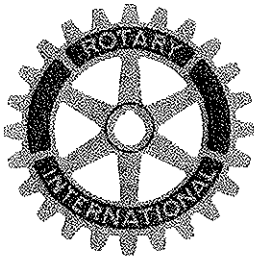

RE: Opportunity for House Demolition through Controlled Burn

Background:

In August, 2012 Council adopted a Zoning Amendment Bylaw that changed the zoning for the residential property located at 1042 Hillside Avenue from "R-1 Low Density Residential" to "R-1A Low Density Small Lot Residential." Presently, an older house sits on the property. The applicant's intention is to remove the house and subdivide the property into two developable lots.

To have the house demolished by a demolition contractor would cost the owner several thousand dollars. They have asked if the Village of Chase Fire Department would be interested in burning the house down as a training exercise.

Ralph Adams, Air Quality Meteorologist for the Ministry of Environment states that the Environmental Management Act includes an exemption that permits fire officials to conduct controlled burns for training purposes. However, the burn should only be conducted on a day when the venting index in Chase is "good."

Discussion:

Intentionally burning a building is not to be taken lightly. Buildings usually contain many materials which give rise to significant concentrations of air pollutants when burned. This is the reason that there is a general prohibition of disposing of demolition waste (the same material) by burning. On the flip side, conducting a burn of this nature provides an excellent training opportunity that can lead to improved firefighting skills and thereby enhance property and life safety when an unplanned structure fire does occur.

The Fire Chief and Fire Department Officers have surveyed the property and would be willing to take on the project. They would not burn the sheds on the property though, only the house itself. The attached map shows the location of the property which is in an area surrounded by other residences and is quite close to the CPR railway.

If the burn were to eventually proceed, Village staff would ensure that appropriate insurance and a written contract with the property owner were in place, prior to any action being taken.

Options:

- Option 1: Notify nearby residents and CPR that a controlled structure fire for firefighter training purposes will be conducted at 1042 Hillside Avenue sometime in the next month when the air venting index for Chase is good.**
- Option 2: Ask nearby residents and CPR whether they have any concerns about a controlled structure fire for firefighter training purposes that would be conducted at 1042 Hillside Avenue sometime in the next month when the air venting index for Chase is good and then make a decision on whether to proceed.**
- Option 3: Reject the land owner's offer to allow the Chase Fire Department to burn the house located at 1042 Hillside Avenue for practice purposes.**

Recommendation:


