7. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

7.4 Short-Term Extension of Contract with <u>Commissionaires for Bylaw Enforcement Services</u> Administration is recommending an extension of the contract with the Commissionaires for bylaw enforcement services under the current terms and conditions for a 2 month period. Due to the absence of the Commissionaires contact throughout the month of June a report will not be available until the August 12, 2014 Regular Council meeting.

"That the contract with the Commissionaires BC for Bylaw Enforcement services be renewed for a short term of 2 months ending September 30, 2014, and that prior to that date Administration bring forward a report to Council providing a review of the service, including a proposal to combine bylaw enforcement and animal control services, outlining whether a continuation of the contract with the Commissionaires is desirable."

7.5 Chase CornStock - Request for Grant in Aid

At the May 27, 2014 Regular meeting Administration was to investigate, and report back to Council, the cost to purchase banners that incorporate the Village logo and can be reused annually by the CornStock event organizers. CornStock has withdrawn this request due to tight timelines and are instead requesting \$250 to be put towards their performance and sound technical costs.
