

VILLAGE OF CHASE

BYLAW NO. 400

A BYLAW TO DESIGNATE THE VILLAGE OFFICE IN CHASE AS  
A HERITAGE SITE

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of the Heritage Conservation Act, being Chapter 165 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1979, a municipal council may, by bylaw, designate a building, structure or land, in whole or in part, as a municipal heritage site:

AND WHEREAS Part 3, Section 12, of the Heritage Conservation Act provides also that no person shall:

- a) demolish a building or structure;
- b) alter the facade or exterior of a building or structure; or
- c) build on land

designated under that Part without the prior approval by Resolution of the Council;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Village of Chase deems it desirable to designate the land and building known as the Chase Village Office at 809 Shuswap Avenue, Chase, B. C.

NOW THEREFORE, the Municipal Council of the Village of Chase, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. This bylaw may be cited as "Heritage Designation Bylaw No. One-400, 1989".
2. The parcel of land legally described as Lots 1 and 2, Block G, Plan 514, District Lot 517, Kamloops Division Yale District and the building thereon is hereby designated a Municipal Heritage Site.

CITY OF KAMLOOPS

BY-LAW NO. 1-22

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE OLD COURT HOUSE  
AS A MUNICIPAL HERITAGE SITE

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WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of the Heritage Conservation Act, being Chapter 165 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1979, a municipal council may, by by-law, designate a building, structure or land, in whole or in part, as a municipal heritage site;

AND WHEREAS Part 3, Section 12 of the Heritage Conservation Act provides also that no person shall:

- (a) demolish a building or structure;
- (b) alter the facade or exterior of a building or structure;  
or
- (c) build on land

designated under that Part, without the prior approval, by resolution, of the Council;

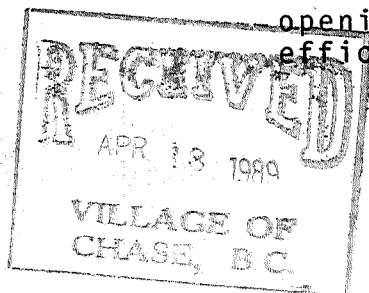
AND WHEREAS the Council of the City of Kamloops deems it desirous to designate the land, structure and buildings known as the Old Court House as a municipal heritage site;

THEREFORE, the Municipal Council of the City of Kamloops, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. This by-law may be cited as the "Heritage Designation By-law No. 1-22, 1984".
2. The parcel of land legally described as Lot 7, Block 2, Plan 193 is hereby designated as a Municipal Heritage Site.
3. The building known as the Old Court House, including the original 1912 Land Registry Office Annex, 7 Seymour Street West, in the City of Kamloops and situated on Lot 7, Block 2, Plan 193, is hereby designated as a Municipal Heritage Site.

Specifically included in this Municipal Heritage designation are:

- (a) All of the exterior walls, facades and the roof of the building known as the Old Court House, including the original 1912 Land Registry Office Annex.
  - (b) The exterior stained glass window of the Courtroom and the stained glass window over the transept in the vestibule.
  - (c) The retaining walls surrounding the north and east perimeter of the property.
4. That with the exception of the windows identified in Section 3(b) all other windows may be replaced or reconstructed within the existing brickwall window openings for the purpose of improving the energy efficiency of the building.



CITY OF KAMLOOPS

BY-LAW NO. 1-15

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PARKS AND RECREATION OFFICE  
AS A MUNICIPAL HERITAGE SITE

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WHEREAS under the provisions of the Heritage Conservation Act, being Chapter 37 of the Statutes of British Columbia 1977, a municipal council may, by by-law, designate a building, structure or land in whole or in part as a municipal heritage site;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the City of Kamloops deems it desirous to designate the buiding known as the Parks and Recreation Office as such a heritage site.

THEREFORE, the Municipal Council of the City of Kamloops enacts as follows:

1. This by-law may be cited as the "Heritage Designation By-law No. 1-15, 1979" passed pursuant to the provisions of Section 2 of the said Heritage Conservation Act.
2. The building known as the Parks and Recreation Office, 118 Victoria Street, and situated on Lots 19 and 20, Block 13, Plan 193, is hereby designated as a municipal heritage site.
3. The north, south, east and west walls of the building known as the Parks and Recreation Office are hereby designated as a municipal heritage site.



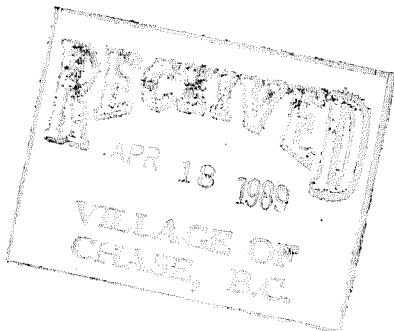

CITY OF KAMLOOPS

BY-LAW NO. 1-13

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE STUART WOOD SCHOOL  
AS A MUNICIPAL HERITAGE SITE

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WHEREAS under the provisions of the Heritage Conservation Act, being Chapter 165 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1979, a municipal council may, by by-law, designate a building, structure or land in whole or in part as a municipal heritage site;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the City of Kamloops deems it desirable to designate the building known as the Stuart Wood School as such a heritage site.

THEREFORE, the Municipal Council of the City of Kamloops enacts as follows:

1. This by-law may be cited as the "Heritage Designation By-law No. 1-13, 1980" passed pursuant to the provisions of Part 3 of the said Heritage Conservation Act.
2. The north, south, east and west walls of the building known as the Stuart Wood School, 245 St. Paul Street, and situated on Block 23, Plan 194, are hereby designated as a municipal heritage site.
3. That reconstruction of the windows within the existing brickwall window openings be permitted if required to improve the energy efficiency of the building.
4. That if City and/or Provincial regulations dictate changes to the stairwells which necessitate additional structure outside of, or attached to the existing walls, that such changes be permitted so long as the additions are designed and constructed in a manner which is compatible with the original design.


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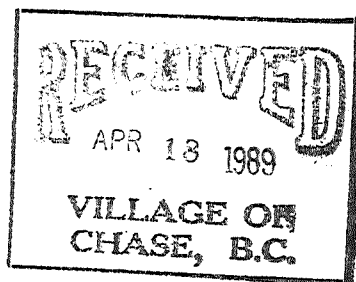

BY-LAW NO. 1-27

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE OLD CHINESE CEMETERY  
AS A MUNICIPAL HERITAGE SITE

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WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of the Heritage Conservation Act, being Chapter 165 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1979, a municipal council may, by by-law, designate a building, structure or land, in whole or in part, as a municipal heritage site;

AND WHEREAS Part 3, Section 12 of the Heritage Conservation Act provides also that no person shall:

- (a) demolish a building or structure;
- (b) alter the facade or exterior of a building or structure; or
- (c) build on land

designated under that Part without the prior approval by resolution of the Council;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the City of Kamloops deems it desirable to designate the land and monuments known as The Old Chinese Cemetery.

NOW THEREFORE, the Municipal Council of the City of Kamloops, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. This by-law may be cited as "Heritage Designation By-law No. 1-27, 1988".
2. The parcel of land legally described as Lot 4, Section 12, Township 20, Range 18, West of the 6th Meridian, Kamloops Division of Yale District, Plan 16057, except Parcel A (E22878) thereof, known as the Old Chinese Cemetery and all monuments situated thereon is hereby designated as a Municipal Heritage Site.
