Low Density Residential (R1), Low Density-Small Lot Residential (R1A)		
or Medium Density Residential (R2), Limited Medium Density Residential		
(R2A), Recreational Residential (R5)		
Parcel is at least 550 m ²		
Applicant is the property owner or has received written permission from		
property owner to keep hens		
Registered with the BC Premises Identification Program (BCPID)		
No more than four (4) hens per parcel		
No roosters on site		
Coop is provided with an attached outdoor hen enclosure that is		
enclosed on all sides		
Height of coop and outdoor hen enclosure does not exceed 2 metres		
(6.56 feet)		
Combined floor area of coop and outdoor hen enclosure does not		
exceed 10 m ² (107.6 square feet)		
Coop is fully enclosed and constructed to:		
- Eliminate potential for infiltration from predators and rodents		
- Provide reasonable sound attenuation		
- Ensure proper ventiliation and sufficient space for hens		
- Be accessible for persons to clean and maintain the coop		
Coop provides each hen with its own nest box and perch that is at least		
15 cm (6 inches long)		
Coop and outdoor hen enclosure are situated in a back yard which has		
a continuous fence that is in accordance with Section 4.10 Fences of the		
Zoning Bylaw		
Coop and outdoor hen enclosure located entirely to the rear of the parcel		
and setback at least 3 metres (9.84 feet) from rear or side lot line		
Feed for backyard hens is stored in sealed containers and not located in		
an area accessible by pests, wildfire or domestic animals
