Attached is a letter from the Fire Chief regarding the First Responder program, and a summary document of activities during the trial period. The Fire Department is requesting that Council consider entering into a formal contract with BC Emergency Health Services to provide for the First Responders program on an ongoing basis. If a formal contract is entered into, the Fire Department is requesting a budget to provide for call-out pay to the First Responders, a stipend for the program coordinator, and funding for vehicle usage. Currently the Fire Department utilizes their 'staging' Unit for First Responder calls.

In terms of budget requirements, BC Emergency Health Services has committed to continue supplying medical equipment for the program and will also fund training for untrained members as well as the re-certification of currently trained members.

Budget required by the Village if Council agrees to continue with the program on a permanent basis is estimated as follows:

- \$9,000 for paying department members for call-outs, and paying an honourarium to a member to coordinate training, certifications
- \$2,000 for fuel, vehicle maintenance

Total for 2022 \$11,000

**Chase Fire Rescue** 

**RE:** First Responder Program

Chase Fire Rescue has completed five (5) months of the trial First Responder program. As this program is new to CFR, there has been some learning curves and adjustment along the way. CFR has received very positive feedback from the patients and families that we have assisted with. The CFR members that have responded to the medical call are also feeling very good about the F/R program. As a department, we have agreed to continue with the First Responder Program. As you know, In the beginning of the program there were complications with the Contract that BCEHS was to supply. Since then, the contract has been agreed upon by both parties. That being said, Chase Fire Rescue was delayed almost two (2) years before the program started. Originally, we had 12 members of Chase Fire Rescue licensed as First Responders, now that some time has passed, we only have eight (8) members licenced. If Mayor and Council agree to continue with the First Responders program, we would like to have other members trained. CFR has six (6) members wanting to take the F/R program, also the eight (8) members that are licenced members in F/R need to be re-certified starting in March of 2022, we hope this training/re-certification will be included with the new contract along with medical supplies being re-stocked from BCEHS. If BCEHS is reluctant of offer the training/re-certification in F/R, we have members willing to take training so CFR can teach F/R in house.

If Mayor and Council agree to the F/R program, CFR would like to have an operational budget and a stipend for a First Responder coordinator. The F/R coordinator would be responsible for all training and maintenance training as well

as scheduling and dealing with situations that arise from time to time. The CFR F/R coordinator would also be responsible for all paperwork, budget and monthly reports to Mayor and Council. CFR hopes to have our F/R members paid on call and training twice a month at the present rate of \$15 per/hour.

Chase Fire Rescue

Please see attached report on F/R call CRF has attended thus far.

The Chase Fire and Rescue Department started a 6-month trial run on the First Responder program June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021.

We have had a total of 35 calls in the 5 months we have been active, averaging 7 calls a month. The calls we have responded to include: Chest pain -11Seizure -1Unresponsive -2Cardiac arrest -2Diabetic shock -1Falls -3Trouble breathing -11COVID -1Stroke -3

SUORCAS

We average 20 min to 1 hour per call.

With each call, we have been equipped with a medical case and supplies, an O2 cylinder and AED pads provided and replenished through BCEHS when needed.

Face shields and 3M respirators have been donated through other sources. Disposable gowns and N95 masks have been provided out of pocket.

At the start of our six (6) month FR trial, we responded with four (4) members as FR was new to each of us.

Within one (1) month we started responding with three (3) members as we found our confidence increasing.

Within the next couple of weeks our goal is to respond with two (2) members, sometimes three (3) members when a new member needs orientation or for training purposes.

During our five (5) month FR trial, we have held 6 practices. 3 of which included paramedics from the Chase station to respond and work affectively together.

The remaining practices consisted of reviewing the FR calls we have responded to and honing our skills.

#### **ISSUE/PURPOSE**

To obtain Council's authorization to proceed with the referral process for a development variance permit to vary the rear parcel line setback.

#### **OPTIONS**

- 1. Accept the application and authorize Administration to proceed with the required referral process and prepare a draft Development Variance Permit that would vary the rear parcel line setback.
- 2. Do not accept the application.

#### BACKGROUND

The applicant, owner of the property at 1162 Shuswap Avenue has applied to vary the rear parcel line setback distance. The rear parcel setback requires as per the zoning bylaw is 6.0 metres and the application requests a 3.0 metre relaxation.

The configuration of this lot, being an irregular trapezoid and lacking any 90 degree corners, has been a challenge for the house designer.

The applicants are concurrently proceeding through a zoning amendment to update the land use to allow for a secondary suite on the property.

If the application proceeds, notifications will be sent out to property owners within 50 metres of the subject property. Section 499 of The Local Government Act requires notice be provided to affected property owners and tenants.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

#### POLICY IMPLICATIONS

Pursuant to the provisions in the Local Government Act, a local government may, by resolution, issue a development variance permit, in respect of the land covered in the permit, the provisions of a bylaw that regulates Zoning. As a limit to Council's authority, the use or density of land cannot be varied. In the existing case, the use and density of the property is not affected by the granting of the variance request.

A variance application can come forward at any time to vary a regulation pertaining to construction and development. Council needs to consider whether it is in the best interests of the neighbouring residents to allow the variance. The best way to hear from neighbouring residents is to allow the application to proceed and initiate the referral process.


